Pysanka: Ukrainian Easter Eggs

A pysanka is a Ukrainian Easter egg, decorated with traditional Ukrainian folk designs using a wax-resist method. The word *pysanka* comes from the verb *pysaty*, "to write" or "to inscribe", as the designs are not painted on, but written (inscribed) with beeswax. Many other eastern European ethnic groups decorate eggs using wax resist for Easter, including the Poles, Romanians, Croats, Lithuanians, Hungarians, Czechs, Serbs, Slovaks and more additional Eastern European cultures.
