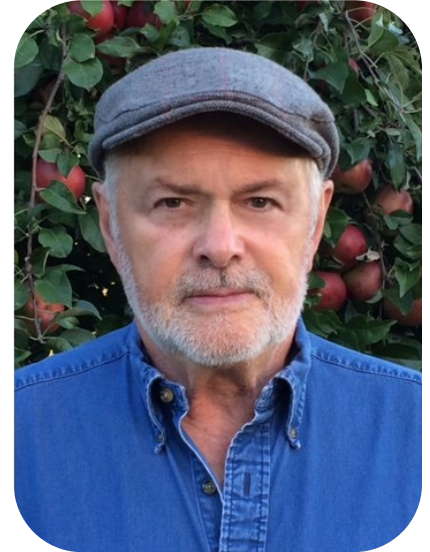
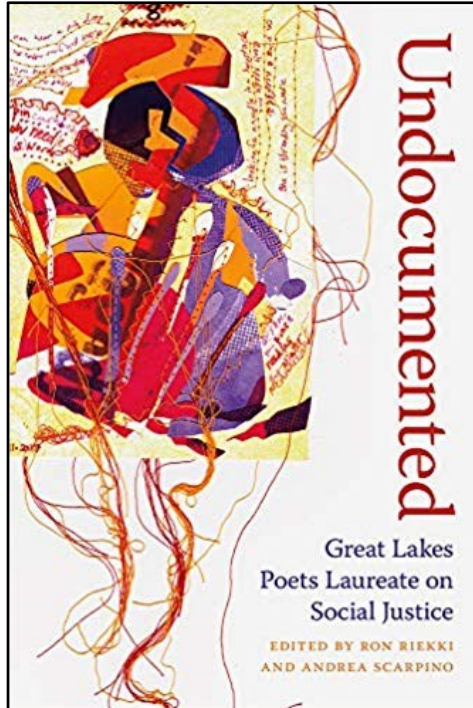


Undocumented:

Howard Paap and his wife Marlene reside in Bayfield, Wisconsin, where he was the Poet Laureate for 2017 and 2018. He taught anthropology at UW-Superior, Northland College, and Century College for over thirty years. A weekly columnist for the *Ashland Daily Press*, he has published four books on the history and culture of the Ojibwe.



Ken McCullough has received numerous awards for his poetry including the Academy of American Poets Award, a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship, a Pablo Neruda Award, a Galway Kinnell Poetry Prize, the New Millennium Poetry Award, the Blue Light Book Award and the Capricorn Book Award. McCullough lives in Winona, MN with his wife Lynn Nankivil, a playwright. He served as Poet Laureate of Winona for three terms.
