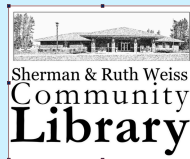
All registrants receive a Day Pass to Jack Link's Aquatic & Activity Center!

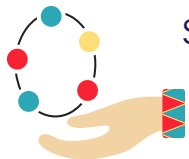

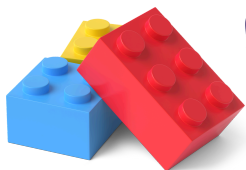
